HOW TO REGISTER:



1. If you are already scheduled to work on the day of a workshop and want to attend, you must obtain approval from your Operations Leader (OL) before you register or swap your shift.
2. If the workshop is scheduled on your day off, you can register on CCRS and do not need to obtain approval from your OL.
3. The first time you register online, you will need to create an account as a PHC Employee, a user ID and password. Be prepared with your employee number and a valid email address. Any previous accounts (i.e. student account) will not work as they do not have permissions to register for these workshops.

5. If you need to cancel a registration go back to <http://ccrs.vch.ca>, log in, and use the 'Cancel' button.

3 MONTH SEMINAR

The first three months of your nursing career is often a difficult time as you transition from student to qualified nurse. This 3 Month Seminar provides you with an opportunity to connect with other New Graduate Nurses and the program Educators, in a safe environment.

Here you can share and discuss / debrief positive and negative experiences that have had an impact on you. Sharing your experiences with other new grads helps each other to realize that you are not alone on this amazing journey.

By attending this seminar, you will develop an understanding of the stage that you are at and how you have a right to be there. This can help to change your focus, develop your professional learning goals and to see the future.

(This seminar does not replace any of the 3 month check-ins that occurs with your unit Educator).

NAVIGATING THE FINAL JOURNEY

This interactive workshop is designed to increase the New Graduate Nurses' knowledge and skills about what signs and symptoms to expect when a patient is nearing the end of life. You will learn how to effectively manage these symptoms and provide comfort to the patient, care for the patient's family members and for yourself.

The workshop helps to dispel myths and uncertainties surrounding death and dying, explores aspects of palliative care philosophy and introduces you to the Palliative Outreach Care Team and Pastoral Care Services. Care of the deceased patient and information on resources for the bereaved will also be presented.

RESPONDING TO EMERGENCIES & MOCK CODE BLUE

This session examines how to prepare for and respond to common emergency situations in the acute care setting. Responding to a "Code Blue" is discussed in detail using a mock arrest case study. Psychological/ emotional impact on family and staff are explored.

ROAD TRIPS – "MY PATIENT IS GOING FOR A WHAT?"

What do I need to know about tests and procedures?

Various diagnostic tests and procedures are done in departments away from the nursing unit. For example, Radiological test which require patient preparation and patient teaching.

Too shy to ask? "What is a PTC? ERCP? Upper GI Series?" These and other tests will be defined, to assist you to better prepare and teach your patient.

RN EXAM PREPARATION

INTERPRETING LAB VALUES

How low is 'low' and how high is 'high'? In this session normal reference values for PHC will be discussed. Using clinical case studies we will review how lab results and their associated clinical signs and symptoms can direct nursing care and patient teaching. We will also discuss when to call the Doctor and consult with the interdisciplinary team to ensure that the patient receives the best care possible.

OPERATION LEADERS & STAFFING Cost Center Instructions
