NEW GRAD EDUCATION WORKSHOPS 2023

CHARGE NURSE MORNING AND ROAD TRIPS AFTERNOON (27666)

The morning provides a glimpse into the role of the charge nurse in an acute care setting. Through the use of case studies, discussion, and interactive exercises, this course introduces the role, resources, and challenges of prioritization, delegation, and decision-making when in the position of charge nurse.

The second half of your day explores various diagnostic tests and procedures done in departments away from the nursing unit. For example, radiological tests which require patient preparation and patient teaching. Too shy to ask, "What is a PTC? ERCP? Upper GI series?" These and other tests will be defined, to assist you to better prepare and support your patient.

NAVIGATING THE FINAL JOURNEY (10070)

This workshop develops nurses' awareness to end of life signs and symptoms, how to manage, and provide comfort to the patient, care for the patient's family members and yourself. The workshop helps to dispel myths and uncertainties surrounding death and dying, explores aspects of palliative care philosophy and resources available such as the Palliative Outreach Care Team and Spiritual Care.

Clinical tools, lab values, and resources are integrated into simulations and the mock Code Blue case studies. This workshop is classroom and skills lab based.

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS: CONTEXT & TREATMENT (27094)

Did you know that the Addiction Medicine Consult Team (AMCT) follows up to a 1/5 of all inpatients at St. Paul's Hospital alone? At PHC, you are likely to encounter individuals across the continuum of care with a history of or who are currently using non-prescribed substances. This interactive workshop is presented by PHC's Substance Use Clinical Nurse Specialist and Nurse Educator, and PHC's Urban Health Nurse Educator. Topics include: Prevention and treatment of withdrawal, responding to overdose, medication and treatment options, harm reduction, and trauma informed care.
