About the S. Patricia Graham Nursing Award

The St. Paul's Hospital Foundation is pleased to offer the S. Who can apply for this award?

- Applicants that are on special leave (i.e., maternity leave, educational leave, leave of absence, etc.) are **NOT** eligible to apply.
- In order to be eligible for this award you **MUST** have registered, paid and completed your educational program or have been participating in nursing research between April 1, 2021 and March 31, 2022.
- Applicants **MUST** provide proof of registration and payment with their application.
